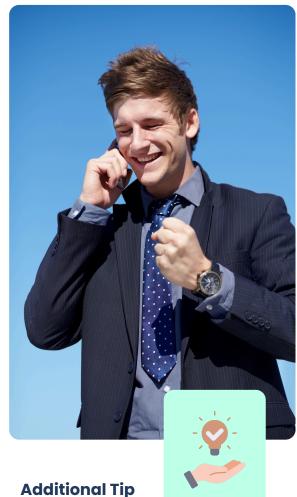

How to Use ATS-Friendly Fonts Effectively

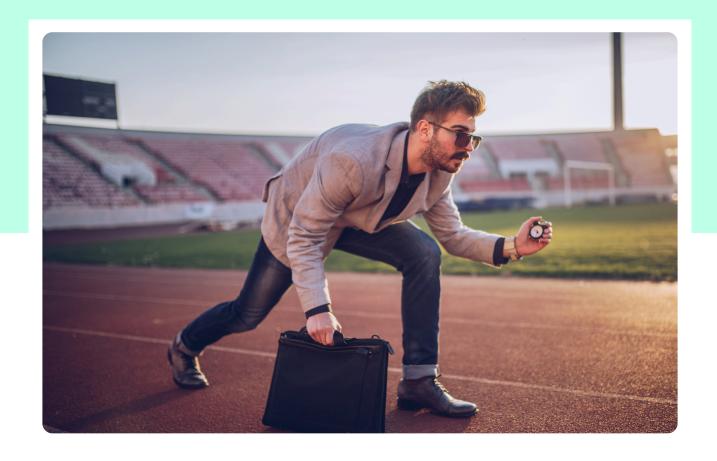
- 1. Consistency: Use the same font throughout for a polished look; avoid mixing fonts to prevent clutter.
- 2.Font Size: Stick to 10-12 points for readability; headers can be 14-16 points.
- 3. Characters: Use standard characters only; avoid symbols or emojis that ATS may not recognize.
- 4.Test It: Upload your resume to an ATS checker, like Rate My Resume, to ensure compatibility.



Some fonts might look appealing but can hurt your chances of making it through ATS screening. Avoid the following:

- Script Fonts: Fonts like Brush Script or Comic Sans are difficult for ATS to read.
- Overly Decorative Fonts: Avoid fonts with intricate designs, such as Papyrus or Algerian.
- Obscure Fonts: Fonts not commonly found in Word or Google Docs may not be recognized by ATS systems.
